

South Luffenham Parish Council
Arrangements for Dealing with Conduct Allegations
Under the Localism Act 2011

1 Context

These Arrangements set out how a person may make a complaint that an elected or co-opted member of South Luffenham Parish Council has failed to comply with the members code of conduct of the relevant authority and how Rutland County Council (the relevant authority) will deal with allegations of a failure to comply with that code.

The arrangements are made under section 28(6) and (7) of the Localism Act 2011 (“the Act”). Rutland County Council is responsible for dealing with allegations concerning Parish Councillors as well as County Councillors.
